2. A mass funeral has been organised for the victims of Friday's suicide bombing on a Shia mosque in Kandahar, Afghanistan's southernmost city. Officials claim 47 people were killed in the incident, but a village elder, Haji Farhad, says the dead toll is 63, but that number might change because several victims are still in critical condition in hospitals. On Saturday, family lay the victims' corpses to rest and urged the Taliban to protect them.

11. 3 million people have fled to Iran and Pakistan since the Taliban (outlawed in Russia) took over, accounting for roughly 10% of Afghanistan's population, CSTO Joint Staff chief Colonel General Anatoly Sidorov told journalists on Thursday. "There was a significant exodus of individuals fleeing the country following the Taliban takeover." He said that about 3 million Afghans moved to Iran and Pakistan alone, amounting for over 10% of Afghanistan's entire population "lition." According to Sidorov, internal migration in Afghanistan reached over 500,000 people, with tens of thousands of Afghan US collaborators deported.
