Current Situation

1. Officials claimed Monday that the Taliban have initiated a crackdown on suspected Islamic State hideouts in southern Afghanistan, following an uptick in brutal strikes by the group in recent weeks. According to Taliban provincial police chief Abdul Ghafar Mohammadi, the operation against Islamic State-Khorasan, the local chapter of the jihadist group, began about midnight on Sunday in at least four districts of Kandahar province and lasted until Monday morning. "So far, four Daesh (IS) fighters have been killed and ten arrested; one of them blew himself up inside a house," a member of the Taliban intelligence agency told AFP. At least three civilians were killed in the operation, according to a member of the Taliban intelligence agency who declined to be named.

According to an Afghan government official, Pakistan will enable India to deliver 50,000 tonnes of wheat via its territory to neighbouring Afghanistan, which is suffering from a serious famine crisis as its economy has stopped since the Taliban took power in August. In a phone conversation, Sulaiman Shah Zaheer, a spokesman for the Afghanistan Ministry of Commerce and Industries, said Islamabad agreed to allow overland wheat imports about a month after Kabul requested permission.

Two people were injured in a bomb blast in Kabul, Afghanistan's capital, on Monday, according to the Taliban's interior ministry, just two days after the Islamic State militant group claimed responsibility for a similar attack. Both bombs were magnetically linked to vehicles, which have grown frequent in Afghanistan. They cause fewer casualties and damage than suicide attacks, but they are employed in targeted killings that weaken security confidence.
