According to European Times, on February 12, a crowd in Pakistan's Punjab area stoned to death a "mentally challenged" man accused of blasphemy for allegedly desecrating the Holy Quran. This isn't the first time mob justice has been used in Pakistan. In November 2021, a mob vandalised and set fire to a police station in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa's Charsadda district when local officials refused to hand over a man arrested for allegedly desecrating the Holy Quran.

Positive stories on steps taken against radical Islam

1. The National Police of Spain arrested five Pakistani citizens for encouraging their compatriots to assassinate anyone who raise their voices against them through social media, dealing a body blow to the country's already established radical Islam. According to a media source, police arrested the Pakistani citizens on February 21 in Barcelona, Gerona, Ubeda (Jaen), and Granada. The detainees, all in their twenties, were sympathisers with a radical Islamist group in Pakistan, the Tehreek-e-Labbaik Pakistan (TLP), which has parliamentary representation and advocates the implementation of Islamic law and the execution of those branded as blasphemers, according to the report.

3. Four Albanian males who have resided in Italy for many years were arrested on Monday by Italian police on suspicion of organising ISIS-inspired terror strikes in the country. The arrests were made in the southern Puglia city of Bari and the northern Piedmont city of Cuneo. Wiretaps revealed the four expressing anti-Western sentiments in chats concerning Ukraine, which they claimed was a target of Western gas ambitions, and COVID-19, a "minuscule soldier of Allah, sent to Earth to punish the unbelief of the westerners," according to police.

4. A London court has sentenced a man who professed allegiance to ISIS to prison for spreading terrorist propaganda, including footage of executions. Ali Abdillahi, who was born in Somalia and has resided in the United Kingdom since infancy, fabricated a university degree to get a position as a cardiographer at a hospital, according to evidence presented before the Old Bailey. Abdillahi, a Dutch national, was discovered in July 2020 using the instant messaging service Telegram to disseminate recordings of an extremist preacher urging followers to take up arms, as well as two ISIS movies depicting gruesome content, including propaganda murders.

5. The National Investigation Agency stated in its supplemental chargesheet against two Jammu and Kashmir residents that the accused were active in recruiting cadres for the Islamic State. The NIA has filed a supplemental chargesheet against Srinagar residents Afshan Parvaiz Jarabi and Tawhead Latief Sofi. The case concerns an ISIS plot to radicalise and enlist Muslim youngsters in India in order to conduct violent Jihad against the country. According to the NIA, an organised effort was started online to attain their goal, which was reinforced by on-the-ground financial initiatives. The case was filed against Qasim Khurasani and his partners, a cyber organisation.

6. Madhya Pradesh's Anti-Terrorism Squad (ATS) has detained four Bangladeshi nationals suspected of being linked to the terror group Jamaat-ul-Mujahideen Bangladesh (JMB). These four Bangladeshi nationals were allegedly involved in the preparation of a distant base for sleeper cells, according to an official statement. Fazhar Ali alias Mehmood (32), Mohd Aqeel alias Ahmed (24), Zahoורuddin alias Ibrahim alias Milon Pathan alias Jauhar Ali (28) and Fazhar Zainul Abdeen alias Akram Al Hasan alias Hussain have been named as the suspects. During the raid, a large amount of radical literature, electronic equipment, and suspicious documents were discovered in their hideout.

7. Two Iraqi military personnel have been slain by ISIS troops in Nineveh region, according to Iraqi security officials. According to a security official, the incident took place at a checkpoint in the city of Makhmur, which is located in southeastern Mosul. ISIS took control of the area in 2014, and after three and a half years of fighting, it was fully liberated in 2017.

9. The Saudi Arabian Ministry of Interior declared that it had carried out capital punishment judgments against people guilty of terrorism and other serious offences. According to the Saudi Press Agency (SPA), these 81 people were convicted of a variety of crimes, including murdering innocent men, women, and children. "These individuals' crimes also include declaring allegiance to international terrorist organisations, including as Daesh, Al Qaeda, and the Houthis," according to SPA. "They also target residents in the Kingdom and go to regional combat zones to join terrorist organisations."
