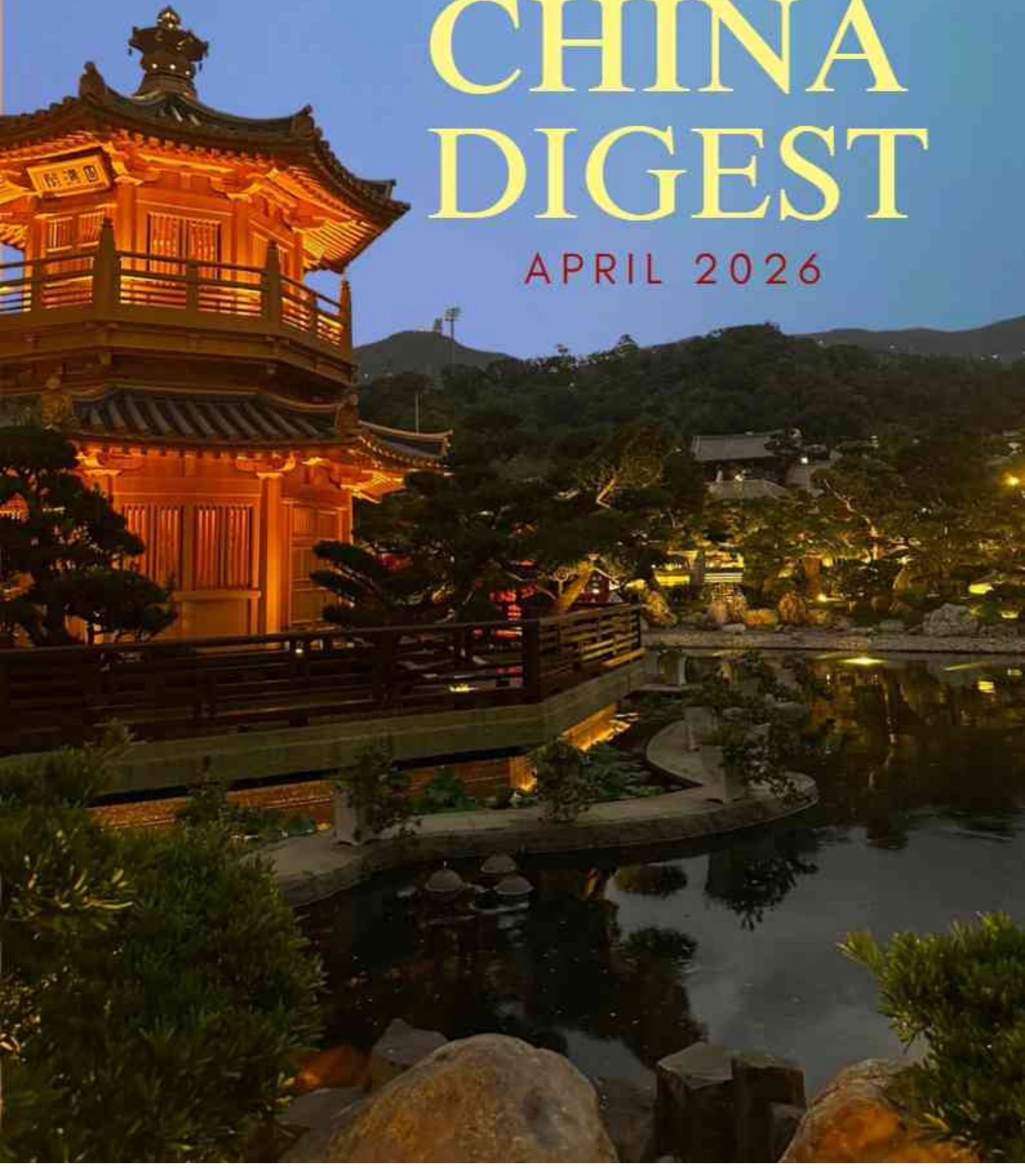

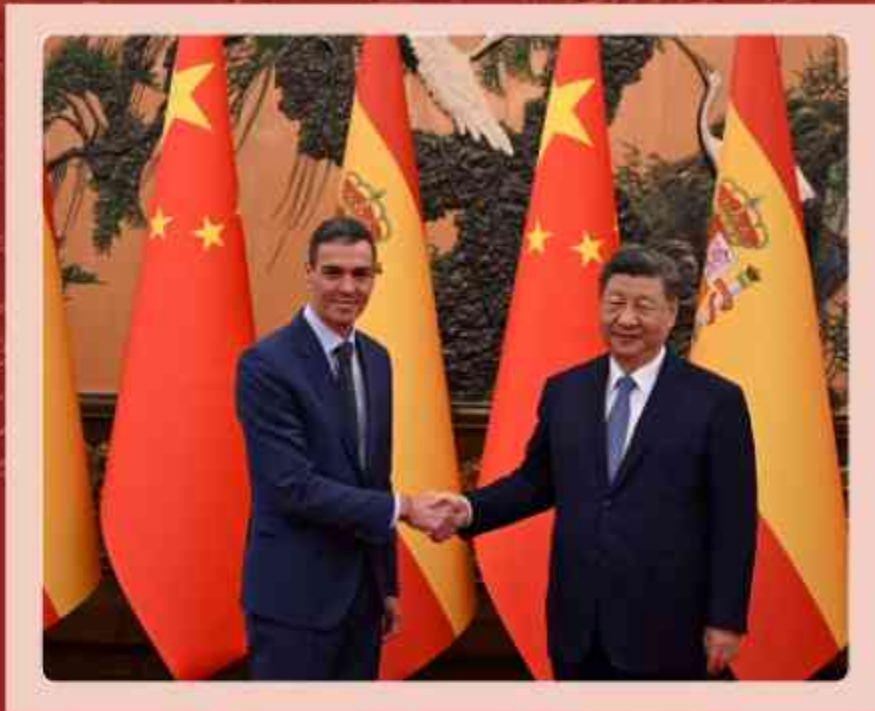

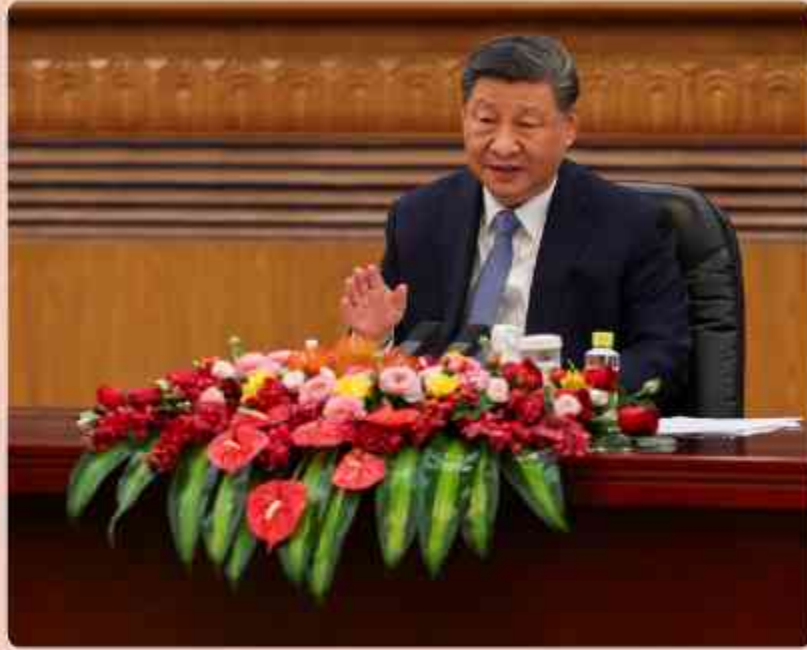

---

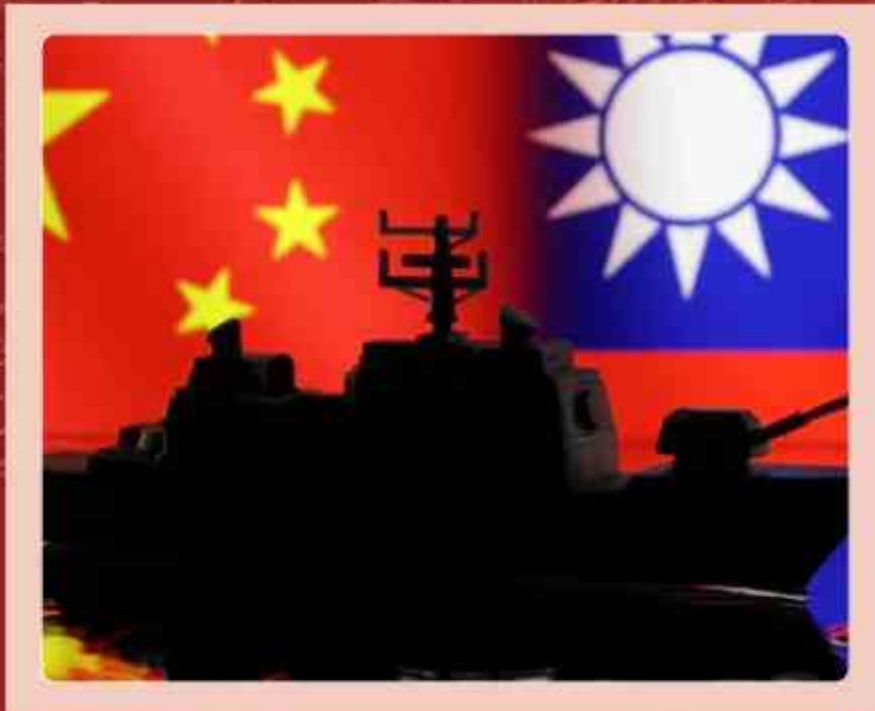

---

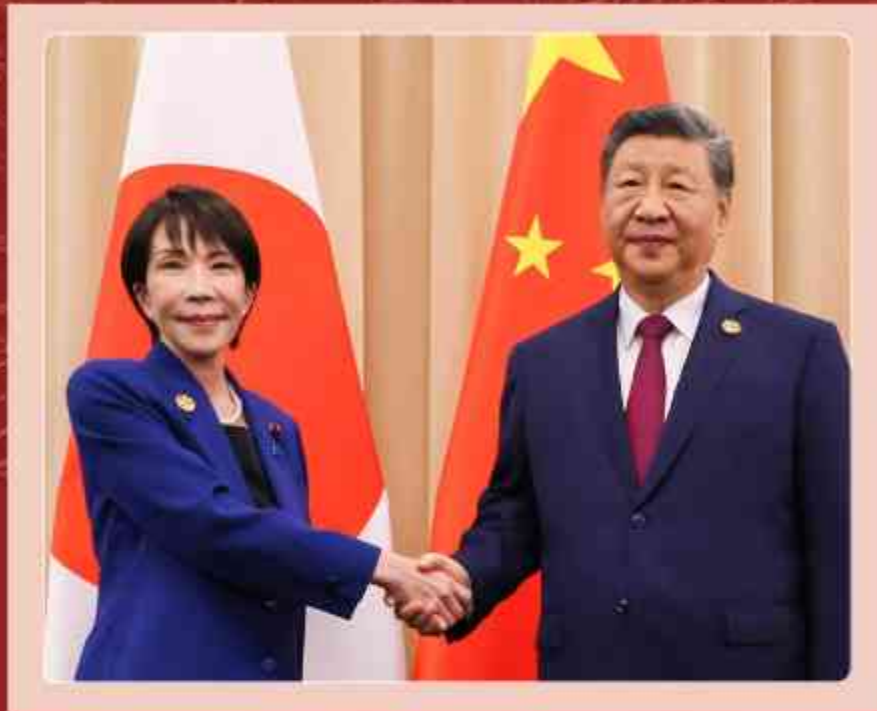
