India Invited to Join UK–France Hormuz Security Initiative

India has been invited to participate in a UK–France-led maritime security initiative in the Strait of Hormuz. The move highlights India's growing strategic relevance in securing critical sea lanes amid rising tensions and underscores expanding cooperation with European partners in safeguarding global energy routes.



India–South Korea Shipbuilding Partnership Gains Momentum

Asia's LNG Imports Fall Amid Supply Disruptions

Asia's LNG imports dropped to a seven-year low as the conflict disrupted Qatari supply chains. The decline highlights the vulnerability of energy markets to geopolitical shocks and supply disruptions.
