EAM Dr. S. Jaishankar meets Ambassador Celso Amorim, Special Advisor to the President of Brazil

External Affairs Minister Dr. S. Jaishankar received Ambassador Celso Amorim, Special Advisor to the President of Brazil, in New Delhi for consultations aimed at strengthening bilateral ties across political, economic, and cultural domains.

During the meeting, both dignitaries reviewed avenues to expand cooperation in trade, investment, and multilateral engagement. The discussion emphasised shared priorities on global governance, climate action, and South–South cooperation, with a mutual commitment to enhance diplomatic and people-to-people exchanges.

The Ministers agreed to sustain high-level dialogue and explore practical measures to deepen strategic collaboration in areas of mutual interest.



PM Modi holds discussions with PM Starmer

Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi engaged in substantive discussions with The Rt. Hon. Sir Keir Starmer in Mumbai to reaffirm the enduring partnership between India and the United Kingdom and to explore avenues for deeper strategic cooperation.

The leaders reviewed bilateral ties encompassing defence, trade, technology, and people-to-people contacts. Emphasis was placed on facilitating enhanced economic linkages, promoting investment, and cooperating on global challenges, including sustainable development and security.

Both Prime Ministers affirmed their intention to maintain regular high-level engagement and operationalize agreed-upon initiatives for mutual benefit.





EAM Dr. S. Jaishankar meets Afghan FM Khan Muttaqi

External Affairs Minister Dr. S. Jaishankar met with Afghan FM Mawlawi Amir Khan Muttaqi to discuss bilateral and regional issues of mutual concern, with a focus on humanitarian engagement and regional stability.

The exchange highlighted India's continued interest in supporting efforts towards peace, humanitarian assistance, and promoting economic connectivity. Both sides discussed channels for cooperation to address humanitarian needs and to foster constructive engagement in the region.

They agreed to maintain open lines of communication and to explore pragmatic steps that could contribute to enduring regional stability.

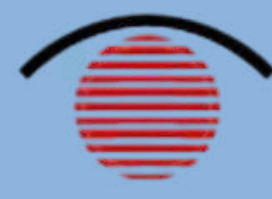
EAM Dr. S. Jaishankar holds discussions with Japanese FM Toshimitsu
